

The Mystery of the Supercontinent

Looking at a map of the world, it is easy to imagine that all the land masses would fit neatly together like a puzzle. In 1912, geophysicist Alfred Wegener (1880–1930) posed that very theory in *The Origin of Continents*, suggesting that all the continents of the planet were once conjoined as one. This theory of continental drift, however, was first posited in 1596 by Abraham Ortelius (1527–1598), cartographer and creator of the first modern atlas.

It was not until 1920 that Wegener coined the term "Pangea" to refer to the massive supercontinent. He derived the term from ancient Greek (pan meaning "all" and Gaia meaning "Mother Earth"). Today, scientists believe that Pangea merged together from even earlier land masses some 300 million years ago and started to drift apart 200 million years ago. During its 100 million years, it resided mostly in the Southern Hemisphere. But it is more than the neatly fitting puzzle pieces that point to Pangea's existence.



Across oceans, geologists have identified matching fossils and identical geological features in, for instance, the eastern regions of South America and the western parts of Africa.

If Earth consisted of one huge supercontinent, it was also home to one big ocean. The term Panthalassa (thalassa meaning "sea") describes this vast area that covered about 70% of the planet. It is believed that today's Pacific is the closest "ocean relative" to Panthalassa as all other bodies of water flowed between land masses while the continents drifted.
